We hope you had a wonderful Thanksgiving, and we want to wish you a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!


Burn season is now open until May 10th. While burn permits are not required, please be safety conscious as you burn those slash piles. Have a water source handy and be ready to rake up coals that may fall outside your burn area. Keep a close eye on the pile until it is dead out and, as always, if the fire gets away from you, don't hesitate to call 911 and ask us for a hand.

We enjoyed visiting with a number of folks at the Fair this summer. We were able to raise just over \$300 selling raffle tickets, and both the winners were actually from the Curley Creek Fire District--- all fair and square!

As we head into the new year, this is a great time to think about supporting your volunteer fire district, either monetarily or by volunteering. Donations are tax deductible. Speaking of colder weather, this is the time to make sure your chimneys are clean and in good repair. A chimney fire can ruin not only your chimney, but also potentially catch the rest of the house of fire—especially areas in an attic or under the roof where you might not notice right away.

While we have not had much snow yet, winter has just started. Please make sure that your driveways are clear and wide enough for emergency vehicles to pass through between the snow banks. They also need wide areas close to the house to turn around and maneuver in case of a fire or other emergency.
